
## Felix the Mouse

Alison loves Elliot. Elliot loves Alison.




Elliot loves the house.


Felix loves the house very much. He says, "It is my house."








Alison loves the house very much. She says, "It is my house."






This is the kitchen.


Alison says, "The mouse loves cheese, right? Yes."




Now it is night. Alison is sleeping. Elliot sleeping.




Felix is not sleeping.

He sees the cheese.




Felix says, "I love chocolate!" Felix eats the chocolate.

He says, "Cheese? No. I do not love cheese."




He does not eat the cheese. Now he is not hungry.

This is Felix's stomach. It is very big.




Why? Because his stomach has an apple, a banana, and chocolate.
